



Principals Report - Mr F.

- The new soft opening of the school is going well. The teachers have made a schedule for the children to enter their classrooms at 8:40 and start to acclimate for their 8:50 start.
- Continuing this year to focus on cultivated support in the classroom environment. We discuss the first six weeks of school as the vital time for students to internalize the routines of the classroom.
- Zones of Regulation is being used to help teach things like self regulation
- Workshop based instruction- mini lessons about 10 minutes are taught then broken into smaller groups after a time the class is brought back and reviews what is being taught

- Small group instruction- Provides a good time for students pulled out for extra support.
- The book "Yardsticks" is a good developmental milestone guide
- Academic rigor- reminding student that they are capable "you can do this"
- Every person that enters the school will need to scan their drivers license
- Reminder that it is not appropriate to take photos or videos while volunteers are here for events and lunches. The restrooms upstairs are for adults, do not use the childrens bathrooms, do not open or prop open any exterior doors, all volunteers must enter through the main entrance
- For lunch, volunteers are there just to serve. There are aides and teachers there to supervise.
- The Promethean boards will be in the music room and 4K classroom. Mrs. Kang is Google Certified and will use it as a learning platform for other staff.
